Review the forest rules and plan ahead before arriving as forest conditions may change.

Certain rules and regulations are designed to protect the health and quality of the forest and safety of users. We ask for your cooperation in observing the following rules and regulations in order to make Boggs Mountain Demonstration State Forest a safe and more enjoyable place to visit

- 1. The forest is open for day use from sunrise to sunset unless otherwise posted.
- 2. Check campground status before arriving 3. Recreational target shooting is prohibited
- 4. Forest Roads are subject to temporary closure during we weather conditions.
- 5. Restrict motor vehicle use to existing mapped and numbered roads. MOTOR VEHI-CLES ARE PROHIBITED FROM TRAILS & CROSS-COUNTRY TRAVEL. No Off-Highway Vehicle (OHV) use is permitted.
- 6. No rock, soil, greenery, forest product, trees or plants shall be cut, defaced, or removed without written permission.
- 7. Pets shall be confined or under restrictive control by owner and leashed no longer than
- 8. No person shall disturb any object or thing of archaeological or historical interest or value.
- 9. No person shall deface, damage or destroy any structure, facility, equipment or property within a State Forest.
- 10. Boggs Mountain is bordered with private land ownership, please respect private property.

Please protect the health and quality of the forest.

Hazards

Numerous life-safety hazards associated with a post-fire landscape remain. These hazards include:



Dead and Dying Trees

While BMDSF has been subject to a large-scale hazard tree removal operation, many dead and dying trees remain that pose a significant life- safety hazard. These trees are quickly losing structural integrity due to decay. Please maintain awareness of your surroundings and stay on numbered roads.



Due to the loss of the forest canopy, the heat hazard at BMDSF during the summer months can be severe. Please bring water with you while enjoying the forest.



Slips and Falls

The fire and subsequent erosion has resulted in loose broken ground across much of the landscape. Uneven ground and burned out stump holes pose hazards. Please stay on numbered roads for your own safety.



Wildlife has returned to BMDSF along with associated hazards. Some of the species present in the forest include: deer, coyotes, foxes, wild pigs, rattlesnakes, and black bears. Please maintain a safe distance from all wildlife.
